Trondheim International Chamber Music Competition has chosen eight participating ensembles which will be competing for prestigious concert engagements and prize money. They are carrying with them to Trondheim great amounts of talent and the ambitions to win the competition!

Musicians from Belgium, France, United Kingdom, South Korea, The Czech Republic, The Netherlands, Israel, United States, Germany, Spain, Japan and Norway are participating at the 7th Trondheim International Chamber Music Competition from 24 to 28 September. The level of the competing ensembles is very high, and we have obviously succeeded in reaching an international audience with applications coming in from across the world. For the first time, the whole competition will be streamed live on our website ticc.no. Tune in and enjoy!

As a young ensemble, it can be very difficult to break through on the international chamber music scene. As a competition prize winner, your odds are greatly improved. This is probably the main reason why so many young ensembles want to participate in TICC.

National and international engagements are an important part of the prize. Some of these are the Tivoli concert series in Copenhagen, Festspiele Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, Nordlysfestivalen and ICMF Stavanger, both in Norway. The three finalists will also compete for prizes of 15000€, 10000€ and 5000€, donated by Torstein Erbo's Memorial Fund, Knut Lund and the City of Trondheim.

Trondheim International Chamber Music Competition is based on a three-year model, where the Academy is the first year, followed by the Competition, and last the winner's Concert engagements.

Torstein Erbo's Memorial Fund was established according to the will of Torstein Erbo who died in 1992. Torstein Erbo took over his uncle's pioneering fish and freezer business in 1948 and later became one of Trøndelag's largest investors on the stock exchange. Torstein Erbo's fund inherited a valuable stock portfolio that was realized in the period 1992-94. Awards from the fund are given for artistic. cultural and scientific projects.

THE CITY OF TRONDHEIM/KÅRE OPDAL PRIZE

Trondheim Municipal School of Performing Arts is the largest arts and music school in Norway (with app. 3000 publis), and has for 20 years been the basis of the great music milieu in town. Through hard work and never ending enthusiasm headmaster Kåre Opdal managed to convince the city council that music education is very important. He introduced the "mini-violin", "Saturday School" and always encouraged chamber music as an important part of the student's education. He retired autumn 1994 but is still active in the musical life of Trondheim. The present city council and Mayor of Trondheim are pleased to recognize the importance of chamber music among young people by especially to honour Kåre Opdal, naming the third prize after him.

The Quatuor Varèse was founded in 2006 and started studying in the quartet class of Zoltan Toth and Reiko Kitahama in the Lyon Conservatoire (CNSMD). In 2007, the quartet joined the Quatuor Ysaye's class in the Paris Conservatoire (CRR). In 2010-2013, they took part in master-classes provided by the National String Quartet Academy in Amsterdam, and studied with Heime Müller, Pr. Eberhard Feltz, Paul Katz, Valentin Erben and Günter Pichler during the master-classes provided by ProQuartet-CEMC. Meanwhile they studied with Miguel da Silva in the Geneva Conservatoire (HEM). The quartet received many awards including the recent 1st Prize of the Hans Schaeuble competition (Zurich, May 2012) and the 3rd Prize in the "Schubert and the modern music" competition (Graz, February 2012).

They have also been awarded the Ravel Academy Prize (2011) for their acclaimed participation in Miguel Da Silva's chamber music class. Since December 2011 they are granted the Fondation Banque Populaire precious support.

Former seasons have taken this young quartet to Berlin (State Library, 2011), Venice (Palazetto Bru Zane, 2011), Québec (Palais Montcalm, 2011), Paris (Radio France, 2011-2013), Japan (tour in November 2010), and Utrecht (Vredenburg, April and December 2012). In July 2011, they had the great pleasure to make their debuts at the Radio France Festival in Montpellier, which included a live performance radio broadcast.

Studying at the National High Schools of Paris and Lyon, the four members of the Van Kuiik Quartet decided to come together to share their passion for chamber music in October 2011. A month later, they attended Ysave Quartet class in Paris, where they are still studying. Van Kuijk Quartet has been selected to take part in the ProQuartet Academy, which gives them the opportunity to study with Günter Pichler, Heime Müller, Rainer Schimdt, They also had lessons with Kitahama Reiko (Ravel quartet) and Luigi Vecchioni (Manfred Quartet). After performing in the Radio France show "The Appointment" with Laurent Goumarre, the Van Kuijk Quartet has appeared in several concerts such as "Festival des Forêts" in 2011 alongside the pignist Dang Ciocarlie and "Festival Ars Terra" in 2012. They will perform this year at festivals such as "Connaissance des Jeunes Interprètes" in Gavaudun, "Rencontres Musicales ProQuartet en Seine-et-Marne" and Gaveau Hall in Paris with Angelika Kirchschlager. The Van Kuijk Quartet became in February 2013 laureate of the FNAPEC competition, obtaining two gwards. the grant from the Academy of Fine Arts and the special ProQuartet-CEMC prize.

The Dudok Kwartet has won 1st prizes at both the 1st International String Quartet Competition 2011 in Radom (Poland) and the 27th Charles Hennen International Chamber Music Competition 2012. In November 2012 they received the 2nd prize at the 6th Joseph Joachim International Chamber Music Competition in Weimar (Germany). Since September 2011 the Dudok Kwartet studies full-time at the Dutch String Quartet Academy. Their main teacher is Marc Danel from the Quatuor Danel. The members of the quartet met in the Ricciotti Ensemble, a Dutch street symphony orchestra. From 2009 till 2011 the Dudok Kwartet studied with the Alban Bera Quartett at the Hochschule für Musik in Cologne. They participated in master-classes with members of the Lindsay Quartet, the Takács Quartet, Ysaye Quartet and Eberhard Feltz. The Dudok Kwartet gave the world première of Julius Röntgen's Concerto for String Quartet and Orchestra in the Czech Republic, followed by concerts in the Netherlands, Also, many well-known contemporary classical composers, such as Kaija Saariaho, Mark-Anthony Turnage and Calliope Tsoupaki worked with the Quartet on their music. The Dudok Quartet has performed with many renowned quest musicians such as Pieter Wispelwey, Dmitri Ferschtman, Ferdinand Erblich, Mikhail Zemtsov and Quirine Viersen. The Dudok Kwartet performed at many prestigious festivals, such as the Gergiev Festival (Rotterdam), the Grachten Festival (Amsterdam) and the Linari Classic Festival. Furthermore they gave concerts in every main concert hall in the Netherlands and throughout Europe.

Formed in 2009, the Idomeneo Quartet currently holds the Chamber Music Fellowship at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. Already regarded as one of the most exciting young quartets on the music scene, the Idomeneos are studying under the tutelage of the Vogler Quartet in Stuttgart, Rainer Schmidt in Basel and Alasdair Tait in Iondon.

At the 54th Jeunesse Musicale course in Weikersheim, Germany, they were awarded the prize of "the most convincing newcomer ensemble" by the Friends of the Jeunesse Musicale in Germany; their final concert was broadcast live on German radio to critical acclaim. The Quartet also won the Tunnell Trust Award with concert tour of Scotland being part of the award. More recently, they have been selected as young artists for the Park Lane Group. The Idomeneo Quartet has been privileged to receive masterclasses from, amongst others, Bernard Greenhouse, Gary Hoffmann, the Belcea Quartet and Günter Pichler (Alban Berg Quartet).

The Idomeneo Quartet recently performed at the White Crow Music Festival in the Netherlands. Future commitments include concerts at festivals such as the King's Lynn Festival , Heidelberger Frühlung Internationales Festival in Germany were they will perform Schoenberg's Verklärte Nacht with members of the Alban Berg Quartet. The Idomeneo Quartet have already held recitals in numerous concert venues all over Europe and extensively the UK. This included concerts in the Barbican and Festival Halls in London. Levon ChilingirianChairman of the Jury

Trondheim International Chamber Music Competition is delighted to present Levon Chilingirian as head of the jury. From his student days, Levon Chilingirian was drawn to the wonderfully rich chamber music repertoire and, in 1971 formed The Chilingirian Quartet with three other ex-RCM students. The Quartet has held residencies at Liverpool and Sussex Universities and is currently attached to the Royal College of Music. It is one of the most active and celebrated string quartets on the international scene with tours to over fifty countries on six continents.

Levon Chilingirian was invited to give the String Master Class for the BBC TV's Young Musician of the Year and has appeared as soloist with the BBC Symphony, London Philharmonic, Bournemouth, Liverpool Philharmonic, Scottish Chamber, Bergen Philharmonic, Armenian Philharmonic, and Russian National Orchestras. He has received the Cobbett Medal, the Royal Philharmonic Society's chamber music award and, in January 2000, an OBE in the Queen's Honours List for his "services to music". He is an esteemed pedagogue who has influenced generations of young chamber musicians as a committed and impassioned mentor, and enjoys the affection and respect not only of audiences world-wide but also of his many eminent colleagues.



Håvard Gimse

is one of Norway's leading musicians with a repertoire including an impressive list of 30 performed piano concertos. He is heavily in demand as both soloist and chamber musician and his vast experience means he is also the accompanist of choice to many of Scandinavia's finest artists. His recordings of lesser known Scandinavian and Norwegian works, arrangements and composers, have all received superb reviews and prizes including Diapson d'Or and Gramophone's Critics Choice. Håvard Gimse combines his hectic concert schedule with a Professorship at the Norwegian Academy of Music as well as giving regular master classes across Norway and beyond. As a concerto artist, Håvard Gimse has performed extensively throughout Scandinavia, and he has performed on many of the world's most prestigious stages including the Wigmore and Carnegie Halls, Palais des Beaux Arts, and the Concertaebouw.



Louise Hopkins

made her debut at the Barbican Hall playing Witold Lutoslawski's Cello Concerto with the composer conducting of which The Times commented that 'players with such personality agility and power are rare' and The Independent that 'within minutes Hopkins had exorcised the spirit of Mistislav Rostropovitch'. At this time she won the NFMS, Southeast Arts and Park Lane Group young artist awards resulting in numerous recitals throughout the UK. Louise also won the Frank Britton Award which resulted in her first solo appearance at the Wigmore Hall. She has continued to perform regularly at the Wigmore both as a soloist and chamber musician to this day and has developed an international career which has taken her all over Europe the USA, Australia, New Zealand and Japan. As a chamber musician Louise has performed in venues from the Wigmore Hall to the Sydney Opera House. Louise has recently been appointed Head of Strings at the Guildhall and maintains there a high level award winning class. She has given masterclasses in France, Germany, Switzerland, Serbia and throughout the UK and in September 2007 began as a Cello Professor at the Hochschule in Bern Switzerland.



Thomas Right

Born in Vienna in 1956, Thomas Riebl studied with Siegfried Führlinger, Peter Schidlof and Sandor Vegh. He has won prizes at the International Competitions in Budapest (1975) and Munich (ARD 1976) and in 1982 won first prize and the Ernst Wallfisch Memorial Award at the International Naumburg Competition New York. Thomas has appeared as a soloist at venues such as Carnegie Hall, Concertgebouw Amsterdam and the "Goldene Saal" of the Wiener Musikverein, and he has been invited to many of the major international music festivals. From 1972 - 1979 he was a member of the Franz-Schubert-Quartett, Vienna; subsequently he became a founder member of the Vienna String Sextet (1979 - 2004), which performed worldwide and recorded several CDs for EMI and pan classics. Since 1983, Thomas Riebl has been a professor at the University Mozarteum Salzburg and has given numerous master classes worldwide. He is artistic director of the Internationale Sommerakademie Bad Leonfelden, Austria and has recorded for RCA, pan classics and Hyperion Records.



Marianne Thorsen

has established herself as one of Norway's leading violinists, recently performing with ensembles including the Philharmonia Orchestra, City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra, Orchestra de la Suisse Romande, the Royal Danish Orchestra, Berlin Symphony and the Royal Stockholm Philharmonic. She plays regularly with the leading Norwegian Orchestras. Marianne Thorsen enjoys a regular collaboration with the Trondheim Soloists, with whom she have toured and recorded Mozart: Violin Concertos Nos 3, 4 and 5 for 2L Recordings to great critical acclaim: the disc was awarded the Norwegian Spelleman Prize. Another recording for 2L (Ståle Kleiberg's Violin Concerto with the Trondheim Symphony) received a Grammy nomination in 2010. As a chamber musician, Marianne Thorsen has performed with such eminent artists as Leif Ove Andsnes, Truls Mørk, Pascal Rogé and the Norwegian pianist Håvard Gimse, with whom she recorded for Simax Classics. She was a founder member of the Leopold String Trio, with whom she performed extensively at venues including Carnegie Hall, the Musikverein in Vienna, Amsterdam's Concertgebouw and Wigmore Hall. Marianne Thorsen is professor at the Department of Music at the Norwegian University of Science and Technology (Trondheim).

Wihan Quartet, formed in 1985, are heirs to the great Czech musical tradition. The Quartet's outstanding reputation for the interpretation of its native Czech heritage and of the many classical, romantic and modern masterpieces of the string quartet repertoire is widely acknowledged. During the 2012/13 season the Quartet have been appointed Czech Chamber Music Society Resident Ensemble at the Rudolfinum Dvorak Hall, Prague. They have developed an impressive international career, which includes visits to major festivals in Europe and the Far East. They visit the United States and Japan regularly and have had highly acclaimed tours of Australia and New Zealand.



The Wihan Quartet has won many International Competitions including The Prague Spring Festival and the Osaka 'Chamber Festa'. In 1991, they won both the First Prize and the Audience Prize in the London International String Quartet Competition. During 2008 the Quartet completed the first ever cycle of Beethoven Quartets in Prague and also repeated this cycle at Blackheath Halls, London. Their landmark series of Beethoven concerts in Prague was recorded for release on CD and DVD on the Nimbus Alliance label.

Trygve Brøske: The old song that got stuck in my head (2013)

Composer Trygve Brøske (b.1973) combines his composing work with a career as a performer, as well as regularly collaborating with other artists on projects integrating spatial and theatrical elements. He graduated from Trøndelag Music Conservatory and the Conservatoire de Musique de Genève where he graduated with the Premier Prix de virtuosity spring 2001. As a composer he has very varied productions. He has composed music for Trondheim Chamber Music Festival, a lot of choral music, various chamber ensembles and theater music. He has done several solo concerts in Scandinavia and Switzerland, and also participated as a chamber musician at festivals around Europe. Trygve premiered Henning Sommeros piano concerto Triguarta with Trondheim Symphony Orchestra in February 2002, and has otherwise been a soloist with l'Orchestre de la Suisse Romande. Trygve Brøske is the initiator and artistic director of the bi-annual chamber music festival Stangvik Festival with a strong emphasis on contemporary music. He work as a professor of piano at NTNU, Department of Music in Trondheim (Conservatory of Music). He was awarded the Consumer Cooperatives Culture Prize in 1998 and Kleiva Prize in 2003

TICC 2013 ARTWORK/ ARTIST

Inger Sitter, born in Trondheim in 1929, is one of our foremost painters and graphic artists, and one of those who contributed to bringing non-figurative and abstract painting "in from the cold". Sitter often worked based on an experience of nature. She talked about rock shapes and tree trunks as sources of inspiration for her abstract pictures. Sitter has made public artworks for the Government Building, the Norwegian School of Economics in Bergen and the cruise ship Norway. In 1999 she was appointed a Knight of the Order of St. Olav, and in 2010 she was promoted to Commander of the same order.
