Torstein Erbo's Fund was established according to the will of Torstein Erbo who died in 1992. Torstein Erbo took over his uncle's pioneering fish and freezer business in 1948 and later became one of Trøndelag's largest investors on the stock exchange. THE CITY OF TRONDHEIM "KÅRE OPDAL"

Trondheim Municipal School of Performing Arts is the largest arts and music school in Norway (with app. 4000 pupils), and has for 20 years been the basis of the great music milieu in town. Through hard work and never ending enthusiasm headmaster Kåre Opdal managed to convince the city council that music education is very important. He introduced the "mini-violin", "Saturday School" and always encouraged chamber music as an important part of the student's education. He retired autumn 1994 but is still active in the musical life of Trondheim. The present city council and Mayor of Trondheim are pleased to recognize the importance of chamber music among young people by especially to honour Kåre Opdal, naming the third prize after him.

KIM TRIO

The award winning Korean piano trio Kim Trio was founded in Vienna by the three sisters; Nayoung Kim (piano), Taehyun Kim (violin) und Jiyeon Kim (cello). They were awarded 3rd Prize in Trondheim International Chamber Music Competition in 2003, and have followed the growing reputation of the competition with great interest ever since. Kim Trio have played in festivals and given concerts in Austria, Germany, Italy, Norway, Australia, Brazil and Korea. Their performances have been broadcasted live by NDR, NRK, RBB, ABC (Australian Broadcasting) und KBS(Korean Broadcasting). The Kim Trio have kindly donated the "Kim Trio Commission Pize". This is the first time Trondheim International Chamber Music Competition awards a prize for the best interpretation of the competitions commissioned piece.

TRIO INCENDIO (CZECH REPUBLIC)

Trio Incendio was founded in 2016 in Prague, where all the members grew up. The first mentor of the trio was Martin Kasík, nowadays the trio collaborates with Ivo Kahánek. In the last two years, they won several national and international competitions like Gianni Beraamo Classic Music Award in Lugano, Coop Music Awards in Cremona, Concorso Musicale "Marcello Pontillo" in Firenze, Kiejstut Bacewicz Competition in Lodz and Bohuslav Martin Competition in Prague. Trio Incendio participated twice in the International Summer Academy Prague-WienBudapest in Reichenau (organized by the University of Music in Vienna, where they worked with members of) the Artis Quartett and other distinguished professors and chamber musicians like f. e. Hatto Beyerle, Avedis Koyoumdjian and Vida Vujić, Anita Mitterer, Patrick Jüdt or Péter Nagy. At this academy, they were awarded the Wiener Klassik Prize, Prize of the Czech Association of Artists and Scientists. Bohuslav Martinů Prize and Chamber Music Prize for the best chamber music ensemble of the academy. Recently they took part in a public masterclass with Alfred Brendel, focused on Schubert's Trio No. 1 in B flat minor. The trio gives concerts both in Czech Republic and abroad. They have already played in some of the most important European venues such as Wigmore Hall, Philharmonie Berlin or Rudolfinum.

CHRISTA-MARIA STANGORRA, VIOLIN JAKOB KUCHENBUCH, CELLO SUSANA GÓMEZ VÁZQUEZ, PIANO

Trio Le Beau grose from the necessity of finding a common language through the passion for music between cultures from different parts of Europe. Its members - the Spanish pianist Susana Gómez Vázquez, the German cellist Jakob Kuchenbuch and German-Latvian violinist Christa-Maria Stangorra are prizewinners of national and international Music Competitions. The Trio, originally found in 2013, owes its name to the German Pianist and Composer Luise Adolpha Le Beau, whose repertoire, unfairly forgotten, has been rediscovered by the group. Trio Le Beau presents itself regularly in different countries across Europe and has participated in international festivals such as ClasClas Festival/Spain. Koroni Arts Festival/ Greece and Prefête de la Musique in Cologny/ Geneva. Concert engagements have brought them to play at venues such as the Wigmore Hall in London, Bremen Sendesaal, Auditorio of the University of Alcalá de Henares and Erbdrostenhof Münster. From 2016, the aroup is officially supported by the "Society for Promotion of Cultural Work" in Westfalia

Consisting of three prize-winning musicians from Taiwan, Japan and Germany, Yi-Shing Cheng, piano, Eriko Nagayama, violin and Joel Siepmann, cello, Trio Opal was founded in 2017 at the Royal Academy of Music. Each player's extensive experience has led them to win competitions, be orchestral leaders, perform on live radio and more. As a trio, they were nominated by the Academy to be the representatives in the 2018 Intercollegiate Piano Trio Competition in Birmingham, in which they were gwarded 1st prize. They were also chosen to attend the 2018 Trondheim Academy in Norway and the inaugural Birmingham International Piano Chamber Music Festival in November 2018. For the academic year 2018-2019, Trio Opal has been invited to be the CAVATINA Trio-In-Residence at the Royal Academy of Music. They have received coaching from world-renowned professors such as violinist György Pauk, cellist Christoph Richter and pianist Michael Dussek. Furthermore, they will take part in the ChamberStudio masterclass scheme at Kings Place, London with Alasdair Beatson.



Lambert Orkis

Chairman of the Jury

Lambert Orkis has received international recognition as chamber musician, interpreter of contemporary music, and performer on period instruments. He has appeared worldwide with violinist Anne-Sophie Mutter since 1988 and performed with cellist Mstislav Rostropovich for more than eleven years. His wide discography has resulted in multiple Grammy awards and nominations. He was recently honored with Germany's Cross of the Order of Merit.

Sharon Bezaly



Described by The Times (UK) as 'God's gift to the flute', Sharon Bezaly is hailed as a flautist 'virtually without peer in the world today' classicstoday.com. She has inspired renowned composers to write for her and has to date twenty dedicated concertos which she performs worldwide. She is a top prize-winning graduate of the Conservatoire de Paris, a BBC New Generation Artist (2006/08), and the first wind player to be Artist in Residence for the Residentie Orkest (2007/08).



Thomas Hoppe

Thomas Hoppe has developed a strong reputation as an exceptional collaborative pianist. He performs frequently with instrumentalists and singers in the U.S. and in Europe. As pianist of the ATOS Trio he performs throughout the world to highest acclaim. ATOS Trio was awarded the 3rd Kalichstein-Laredo-Robinson Award in 2007 and members of the BBC3 New Generation Artists 2009, the ATOS Trio was awarded a Borletto-Buitoni Prize 2012 in recognition of their artistic excellence.









François Kieffer

François Kieffer and three friends founded Quatuor Modigliani in 2003. The Quartet won first prizes in Eindhoven (2004), Vittorio Rimbotti (2005) and Young Concert Artists Auditions in New York (2006). This lifted the quartet up on the international stage. Kieffer gives master classes and is a driving force in supporting young musicians. Quatuor Modigliani is artistic director of Rencontres Musicales d'Evian.

Sølve Sigerland

As a member of Grieg Trio, Sølve Sigerland has enjoyed success all over the world. His recording of Grieg's string quartet with, among others, cellist Truls Mørk, was awarded French record industry's highest accolade, the Diapason d'Or. He has devoted most of his career to chamber music, although he hasappeared as a soloist with leading orchestras of the Nordic countries.

Tanja Tetzlaff

Tanja Tetzlaff performs an extensive repertoire as soloist and chamber musician. Chamber music with regular appearances alongside Lars Vogt, Leif Ove Andsnes, Alexander Lonquich, Antje Weithaas, Florian Donderer, Baiba and Lauma Skride, and Christian Tetzlaff, is an important part of her career. In 1994 Tanja founded the Tetzlaff Quartett, with Christian Tetzlaff, Elisabeth Kufferath and Hanna Weinmeister.

Marianne Thorsen

Marianne Thorsen has established herself as one of Norway's leading violinists. Her recording of Ståle Kleiberg's Violin Concerto, dedicated to her, received an American Grammy nomination in 2010. Marianne Thorsen was leader of the Nash Ensemble of London from 2000-2015 and a founder member of the Leopold String Trio from 1991-2006 with extensive tours and numerous recordings.

Erlend Skomsvoll is a Norwegian jazz musician, band leader, composer and arranger, known from his own band Skomsork and the bands Trondheim Jazz Orchestra, Wibutee and Come Shine. He has also cooperated with artists such as Nils Petter Molvær, Chick Corea and Pat Metheny.

He has written a great number of works for a great variety of artists, bands, chamber ensembles and orchestras. His "Holbergvariations" recorded with pianist Christian Ihle Hadland and 1B1 chamber orchestra, was awarded the Norwegian award "Spellemannsprisen" for best classical recording in 2014. Erlend Skomsvoll has conducted and led orchestras such as the the Norwegian Radio Orchestra, Arctic Philharmonic, Norwegian Air Force Band, Norwegian Army Band Northern Norway, Trondheim Symphony Orchestra, Trondheim Soloists and Trondheim Jazz Orchestra.

Erlend Skomsvolls piano trio "Playfulness" is commissioned by TICC with the support of the Arts Council Norway. "Playfulness" premiers in second round Wednesday 25th of September in five unique interpretations by five participating piano trios from all over the world in the Free Mason Hall. The best interpretation is awarded the "Kim Trio Commission Prize" of 2 000,-EURO, kindly donated by the Kim Trio.

HÅKON BLEKEN

Håkon Bleken is Norway's foremost contemporary artist and one of the country's most significant cultural personalities. At 90 years old, the Trondheim native continues to paint on the colossal canvas of his life.

Indeed, no living Norwegian artist can point to a more significant and lasting career than Bleken, the work as an artist which King Harald awarded Bleken the Commander of St. Olav's Order; the Norwegian knighthood. His works have been purchased by major museums across Norway and the world. Håkon Bleken made the print for TICC in 2005 when the Danish String Quartet won the competition. It is with great pride and pleasure we present the print made by Håkon Bleken for TICC 2019. The print is awarded all participating trios and to the jury.
